ABOUT GODMANCHESTER BRIDGE ACADEMY

Godmanchester Bridge Academy is a brand new school being built in Godmanchester, on the Romans' Edge development.

Sponsored by Godmanchester Community Education Trust (GCET), which also runs the successful Godmanchester Community Academy, the Bridge Academy seeks to provide the best possible start to education for children aged 4-11 years in the Godmanchester area.

The school opened in September 2016 on a temporary site at Godmanchester Community Academy, and will be moving to the wonderful new premises in September 2017.

The school offers the same high levels of teaching standards, robust organisational structure and wide-ranging curricular and extra-curricular opportunities that are currently offered by our sister school, Godmanchester Community Academy. The state of the art premises will also have a purpose built preschool, a breakfast club and an after school club on site. The school will be established as a community school with a catchment area of the parish of Godmanchester, with a focus on specialist teaching in maths and English.



About Godmanchester Community Education Trust

In 2014, the Academy Trust which has been responsible for running Godmanchester Community Academy since it converted to academy status in 2012, decided to put in a bid to sponsor the new primary school planned for the Bearscroft development.

After a competitive process the bid was successful and as a result the Trust is now a Multi-Academy Trust and is responsible for both schools.

What is a Multi-Academy Trust?

A multi-academy trust is a collaborative organisational structure enabling a single Trust to govern more than one school. This has significant advantages including sharing best practice, economic benefits due to shared costs and central services, flexibility of resources and improved staff retention due to enhanced development opportunities.

Godmanchester Community Education Trust (GCET)

Godmanchester Community Education Trust is a registered company and charity. It has a Board whose members oversee the work of the Board of Directors who are responsible for achieving the Trust's objectives. The Board of Directors implement the strategy on behalf of the Trust, hold school leadership to account, ensure financial probity and are responsible for compliance with the various legal requirements involved in running an organisation of this nature. A number of responsibilities are delegated to local governing bodies, one for each school.

What Godmanchester Bridge Academy can offer you and your child:

Learning at the Academy

The Learning experience at the Bridge Academy involves a forward thinking and modern approach to learning the traditional, fundamental knowledge and skills required by the National Curriculum.

To achieve this vision the mornings are dedicated to acquiring the essential literacy and numeracy skills vital to success in education and life. The mornings are also interspersed with other activities to make the learning fun and never confined to the classroom.

In the afternoons, pupils at the Bridge Academy cover the other areas of the curriculum; learning through a topic based exploration which develops their curiosity, creativity and understanding of the world they live in. The children are then be able to partake (if they so choose) in a number of clubs and activities that extend beyond the official school day but are still important in developing physical, creative and social skills. We also provide a before- and after- school childcare club at which a place is currently guaranteed to all children at the school.

A Family / School Partnership

As we firmly believe that a child's development and progress are best achieved through a close partnership between home and school, the afternoons also provide a number of opportunities for parents to be involved in their child's learning in school, through school-based projects that can be continued at home.

Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) / More Able Pupils

Like its sister school, the Bridge Academy will be fully inclusive catering for children of all abilities.

As the children progress through the school they will increasingly benefit from being taught by teachers who specialise in and are passionate about their subject. Due to the benefits of shared resources across the Trust the children will also have greater access to specialist support and tuition.

Information Technology

The school will be built with IT to the fore, so the children's learning will be continually enhanced by technology that they will quickly become confident and skilled in using. They are introduced to laptops, desktop computers, iPads and bee-bots very early and encouraged to become confident with modern technology.

Community

Community has also been a priority in the design of the building with the accommodation planned to enable a full range of use in the evenings by clubs and groups. The Academy will be at the heart of the new community while connecting fully with the existing community of Godmanchester.

The ethos of the Academy will constantly reflect the Trust's values of: **Respect; Aspiration; Enjoyment; Caring; Determination; Challenge; Honesty and Sharing.**

The Curriculum

Literacy

The rapid acquisition of reading, writing, listening and speaking skills will underpin the learning of literacy at the Academy. This will ensure the children quickly meet the age related expectations of the National Curriculum for literacy at the earliest opportunity.

Mathematics

Early acquisition of the key numeracy skills will be the target for every child entering the Academy, enabling them to progress quickly to become independent and robust problem solvers. They will then be guided and encouraged in developing the capacity to apply mathematical reasoning so they reach Year 6 as able and confident mathematicians.

Foundation Subjects

All the National Curriculum Foundation subjects will be taught through exciting and exploratory learning.

Exact details of the curriculum plan are still to be finalised, these will be available in the New Year.

The School Day

Currently, the school day runs from 8:45am - 3:00pm and it is expected to remain the same after the move to the new site. Extension activities will be available between 3 - 4pm. These activities will be provided as part of the Academy's provision for all children on most days. The extension activities will focus on developing life skills, physical health, social skills, creativity and teamwork.

Out of School Care Provision

This will be available from September 2016 and will run Monday to Friday 7:45 - 8:45 & 3:00 - 6:15. The Academy and the care provider will be responsible for transferring the children between each other's care. This will be extra to the Academy provision and will involve the payment of fees.

Admissions

Godmanchester Bridge Academy has a clearly defined admissions policy which is available via our website and has a catchment area defined as the parish of Godmanchester.

Whilst Godmanchester Bridge Academy has its own admissions policy, this is administered by Cambridgeshire County Council who will receive all applications and administer any appeals. Our PAN (Published Admission Number) for 2016-17 of 55 dictates 20 children in one EYFS class; 10 children in Y1 and 5 children in each year 2,3,4,5 & 6.

(Godmanchester Bridge Academy is a new school built to provide school places for the Bearscroft Housing Development therefore the initial PAN is subject to on-going revision and will be amended to account for the increase in occupied housing over time).

School Staff & Governing Body

Led by the Executive Headteacher of GCET, Rod Warsap, the Bridge Academy will have its own senior leadership team of specialist and experienced teaching staff. Each class will have a designated teacher or teachers, who will be responsible for all aspects of that class and their day to day learning. They will be supported by a team of teaching assistants and ancillary staff.

The Bridge Academy also has its own local governing body, a team of volunteers made up of parents, community representatives and staff who oversee every aspect of the school and its conduct.



School Uniform

The uniform is:

- School royal blue sweatshirt or royal blue cardigan
- School royal blue fleece jacket / coat
- White or blue shirts, polo shirts or blouses
- Black or grey trousers, skirts or pinafore dresses
- Shorts or blue summer dresses in summer

Footwear needs to be sensible and appropriate to the weather and school.

School Facilities

The new school site will have an enviable range of sports & play facilities as well as state of the art teaching facilities including:

- Purpose built classrooms incorporating modern technology
- Multi-purpose hall
- Library hall and activity space
- Multi-use sports pitch which will offer a junior sized football pitch, or three mini-football pitches
- Two hard play courts with netball court markings
- Soft play areas and nature habitats and trails

Before- & After- school care

There will be an on-site Kids' Club for children whose parents require before- and after- school care for their children. This facility is open with the school at the temporary site in September 2016, and will continue at the new site.



Preschool Day Nursery

When the school moves to the new site there will be preschool provision for children aged two years and over. The pre-school is expected to open in January 2018.
