

# Reopening Plan

June 1<sup>st</sup> 2020

**We need to follow the government advice.**



The Department for Education guidance also states that, 'early years and primary age pupils cannot be expected to remain 2 metres apart from each other and staff.' (DfE, 12th May 2020).

# Our Provision

We will be offering a place for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 for four and a half days.

School will finish after lunch on a Friday to allow staff to have the planning and preparation time they need for the following week.

We will continue to offer support to children of key worker families.

# Bubbles

The term 'bubble' refers to groups of children.

There is a maximum of 15 children in each bubble.

The children within each bubble remains the same.

These children are supervised in school by 2 adults all day.

No other children or adults will interact with each bubble.

# Arriving at School

Start and end of the day times will be staggered.

- 8.40 - 2.40 Bubble 1 (EYFS) Friday 12.40pm
- 8.50 - 2.50 Bubble 3 (YR 1) Friday 12.50pm
- 9.00 - 3.00 Bubble 4 (YR 1) Friday 1.00pm
- 9.10 - 3.10 Bubble 2 (EYFS) Friday 1.10pm
- 9.00 - 3.00 Bubble 5 (Keyworker)
- 8.45 - 3.00 Bubble 6 (YR 6) Friday 1.00pm

Please note the early closure on a Friday due to school closing at lunchtime for staff to have their planning and preparation time.

Different year groups will use different entrances.

We ask that parents please stick to these times, avoid gathering at the gates and follow rules on social distancing to ensure we keep everyone safe.

# Arriving at School- Children in EYFS and KS1



On arrival you will be asked to take your child to one of the yellow spots which are 2 meters apart.

A teacher from your child's bubble will call them to enter the school.

As we have staggered start times, there will be a maximum of 15 families on the playground at any one time.

We asked that just one adult brings your child onto the school playground.

# Arriving at School- Children in EYFS and KS1



Parents will be asked to exit around the edge of the playground, as per the green arrow.



# Arriving at School – EYFS and Year 1


Once called, children will enter via their cloakroom door.



Your child will have their temperature taken at the door.




# Arriving at School – Year 6



Year 6 children will enter via the carpark. A walkway will be marked off for safety. The children will walk to the gate, located in the corner on the right hand side of the carpark and wait on a spot which are 2m apart. The children will enter school via the KS2 playground door. They will have their temperature taken.

# Arriving at School – Key Workers



As per current arrangements, children who are eligible for a school place, **but are not in Reception, Year 1 or 6**, will enter via the Kid's Club entrance near the carpark. Again, their temperatures will be taken on arrival.

# Handwashing



On arrival to school, children will enter the cloakroom and wash their hands.

Children will be taught how to wash their hand.

There are posters by every sink to remind pupils about effective handwashing.

Hand sanitising gel is also available in every classroom.

Regular handwashing will be in place throughout the day.

# Items from Home



We ask that children do not bring items in from home.

Where necessary children will be allowed to bring in a packed lunch (in a disposable bag), coat and sun hat. No other items from home are required.



Any items the children do bring will be placed in their tray, located under their designated desk.

All children will be provided with a cup each day, which will be cleaned by our kitchen team.

# Uniform

Children will need to wear clean clothes every day, to help with this we will **not insist** that children wear their school uniform.

We do ask that children wear practical clothes and trainers, as we will be outdoors throughout the day.

PE kits will not be required.

# Classrooms



All children in Years 1 and 6 will have their own desk with their own pack of resources. The desks are spaced apart.





# EYFS Classroom

We do not expect children in EYFS to work at a desk all day.

They will follow their usual routine of carpet time, small group work and busy learning through play. They will also have access to an outdoor space.

We will regularly clean any shared spaces and toys, use carpet spots to space the children out on the carpet and give children individual packs of equipment to use.

The number of children allowed in an area at any one time will be limited.



# Break Time

Children will be able to have a break, but they will stay within their bubble with their two members of staff.

Each bubble has its own outdoor space, which they can access anytime for a break or outdoor learning.

They will have their own designated box of play equipment.

# Lunchtime



Children who choose to have a school dinner will be provided with a cold 'packed lunch' style meal.

The school lunches will be brought down to the classroom and given to the children to eat at their desk or outside. Desks will be cleaned before the children eat at them and of course thorough handwashing will take place.

Children in EYFS and Year 1 who usually receive a universal free school meal will still be entitled to this, as will children in Year 6 who get a free school meal. All other meals will be charged as normal.

Children who do bring in a packed lunch from home must do so in a disposable bag and follow our usual guidance on packed lunches (**no nuts**).

# Toilets



Children will have access to toilets as usual throughout the day. The toilets will be cleaned at the start and in the middle of the day.

As two bubbles may share one cloakroom, children will be shown which toilets to use.

# Home Time

We ask that parents follow the same procedures at home time as they did at drop off.

EYFS and Year 1 - Please wait on a yellow spot for your child to be sent out to you. Once you have your child, please exit around the edge of the playground.

Year 6- Any year 6 parents please wait in the car park.

Key worker- Please collect from outside the hall door.

# Illness

Basic first aid will be carried out by a member of staff within the child's bubble.

If your child is at all ill, we ask that you keep them at home to prevent the spread of any illness in school.

If your child or a member of your household presents any symptoms of coronavirus, you must follow the current self isolation guidance as set out by the government.

# Other Information

During this time, we will not have assemblies or any other activities or events which would mean that bubbles mix. In addition, children will not have access to the corridors.

Our procedures for fire evacuation have been updated in-line with current guidance.

Cleaning will be increased. We have our contract cleaners doing additional cleans during the day and staff have had training to ensure that frequently used resources and surfaces remain clean.

The school office will be contactable via phone and email. We ask that if you need to speak to a member of staff you do this via telephone or class dojo.
